 - Preparation for this meeting:
 - SRBI / Tiered Instruction Resources from the Curriculum Committee Resources List
- 3. Discussion of SRBI / RTI
 - O What is SRBI / Rtl in Tolland?
 - Are there holes in SRBI / Rtl in this area? (Plourd)
 - Currently there are a number of building resources for SRBI / RtI
 - District is short-staffed in this area, thinking about impact of pandemic
 - CT and other states put SRBI into place to better serve students in general education population in order to avoid identification as in need of special education services / Least Restrictive Environment orientation (address students' deficits before they become more pronounced)
 - Pandemic's impact on the SRBI / Rtl
 - (previously working on including co-teaching processes, push-in models for Tier 1)
 - Kids who were having a bit of trouble before will see more students who need SRBI / Rtl assistance
 - Ms Griffin stated she didn't realize that we would be losing a 6th grade ELA teacher.

- Discussed the number of teachers in 5th grade was reduced., In addition seniority dictates which teacher within a certification area gets "bumped" – the certification area is K-6.
 - Positions were lost in final Town Council-BOE Budget meeting (Reduction in Force - destabilized the 6th grade team (ELA) (DOMINO effect of cuts within a system and a contractual agreement) / had to offset the class sizes in grades 3-5 anyway
 - Certification in Connecticut
 - K-6 (general education / can teach any subject to those grades)
 - 7-12 (subject area, and can move down to 6th grade)
 - Question: are the rising 6th graders in need of the double block of ELA? (Griffin)
 - Previous iteration was for 4 ELA Teachers in Reading/Writing
 - Current Iteration is 6th grade Rtl position (ELA)
 - Curriculum will be consistent with 7th and 8th grade model of ELA
 - Middle School model of teaching / reassign staff to balance the model and stabilize class numbers
 - Staffing across district question w/bumping concerns (Dr. Willett will prepare an update)
- SRBI/ Rtl is one of 3 district-wide School Improvement Plan (SIP)
 Goals (each administrator has to articulate a goal related to SRBI/Rtl; DISTRICT GOALS (School Improvement Plan):
 - Academic
 - SRBI / Rtl
 - Culture & Climate
- How do we determine need for returning students? (HB)
 - Universal Screens to determine performance levels / need levels - NWEA (language and math), Dibels (early reading), Daze, BAS (reading), Spire (reading & phonics)
 - Post-Screen, district reaches out to parents to provide Level 2 and/or Level 3 services for kids who need it
 - Occurs before the year (previous year) begins
 - First assessment is usually given in September or October
 - Potential: State of Connecticut seems to be moving away from SBAC and one-a-year assessments, and TOWARD IAB's (and maybe digital)
 - IAB = Interim Assessment Blocks
- We need to make sure that our capacity increases to meet the students' needs (which are leveled based on the greatest need)
 - Staff availability
 - Resources availability
- 25% of IEP's need to be completed (including testing)
- What is the impact of the pandemic and loss of skills with regard to SRBI / Rtl at the High School? (Griffin)
 - o Adjust curriculum to address skill gaps

- State's Plan Post-Pandemic p. 29-30 addresses the "first unit" considerations
- Mastery Learning -
 - Reports out what a student has or has not yet mastered (specific to the student)
- Tolland schools have data regarding how individual students did at home during the pandemic, and will share that information with teachers for 2020-2021 SY / have to address the curricular and skills gaps within the confines of the 180 days and within the confines of the municipal budget
- How can we support the work of SRBI / Rtl Tolland (as a curriculum committee)?
 - Transitioning more staff into the RTI roles (while continuing to manage class sizes)
 - POSSIBLE AREA OF ADVOCACY FOR THE BOE: TALK TO THE STATE LEGISLATORS ABOUT REVISING TESTING REQUIREMENTS!!
- 4. Update for Curricular Implications due to CoVID
 - Three possibilities, plan due to state by 7/24/20
 - All in school
 - Partially at school, partially online
 - Fully online
 - Curriculum Work Update
 - Need to adapt curriculum / make curriculum adjustments based on what happened at the end of the year
 - Need to adjust math curriculum to / adapt Singapore Math (alignment) in the next fiscal year
 - Usually completed by teachers outside of contractual hours
 - Were well-adapted to jump into the work because of existing procedures to revise curriculum
 - Problem that we face is that we could use some more staff / rev up some of the programs and curriculum
 - Reviewed the procedures for teachers requesting a change for curriculum
