For a Book

Format:

Author's Last Name, Author's First Name. *The Title of the Book*. Publication Location:
Publisher, Date of Publication.

Example:

Zusak, Markus. *I am the Messenger*. New York: A. A. Knopf, 2002.

For a Magazine

Format:

Author's Last Name, Author's First Name. "Title of the Article." *Magazine Title*. Date of
magazine: Page(s) of article.

Example:

Johnson, Steven. "Virtual Law and Order." *Discover*. April 2006:24-25.

For a Website

Format:

Author's Last Name, Author's First Name. "Title of Document." *Title of Website*. Date of
Publication. Medium. Date Accessed.

Example:

"Leonardo Da Vinci Biography." *Encyclopedia of World Biography*. Advameg, Inc. 2013. Web.
4 Feb. 2012.

Your Works Cited Page should look something like the one shown below. Make sure that if you're using www.easybib.com that you fill in the blanks and don't forget that databases generate *full* citations for you.
